Road Bike Safety

Band Opportunity – Leeming High School

Banksia Park is working in partnership with Leeming Senior High School to establish a combined school's band. Expressions of interest have been sent out to Leeming High School's feeder schools inviting interested students and their families to attend an information session at LHS this coming Monday 7th April (Week 10) at 3.30pm in their Performing Arts Centre.

We are hopeful that there will be sufficient interest to build a sustainable band opportunity for primary school students. This new band is open to ANY Yr 5 or 6 student attending primary school in the area that is learning a musical instrument. (Please note this band opportunity will not be suitable for students' learning guitar, ukulele and strings at this stage). If you are learning to play an instrument (privately outside of school or at school) and can play at least 5 notes, then this BAND might be for you.

When: Band rehearsals will be Monday afternoons, 3:15-4:15pm each week during term, commencing in Term 2 at Leeming High School Performing Arts Centre.

Cost: For the remainder of this year schools will subsidise students costs as we work to establish a sustainable program. There will be a small cost each term of just \$25 per student (\$75 for the remainder of 2025), payable to the school office.



Free Dress Day Crazy Hair Day

Sport Update



It's been an exciting few weeks of sport at Banksia Park! Students across all year groups had the fantastic opportunity to take part in football clinics run by the Western Australian Football Commission. These sessions were a great way for students to develop their skills, stay active, and enjoy the game.

Currently, our Year 3–6 students are taking a swing at golf with clinics run by Golf WA. It's been wonderful to see them learning new techniques and embracing the challenge of the sport. A big thank you to our visiting coaches for sharing their expertise and making sport at Banksia Park so engaging! We had our SCISA Cricket Carnival this week at Riverton Reserve. With a majority of our Year 6 students having not played Cricket before we went in with a growth mindset and the goal of enjoying our day, supporting each other and displaying great sportsmanship. Here is what our Year 6's have reported about the day:

"Tuesday the 1st of April, we had the most amazing cricket carnival ever! Our first game was against Oberther, of which we lost miserably by 120 points, but we lost with a smile on our face and ready for the next game. Our next game was against Riverton, and again we lost horribly but we lost by less points this time, so at least we were improving! We then played against Rossmoyne, which we lost by only 6 points! We were very happy that we didn't lose by 100 points, and against a really good team. Our second last game was against Parkwood it was so intense and we ended up losing by only 2 runs! Finally, we played Bull Creek where we absolutely smashed them! We won by 20 points. I know, such a big difference of points".

Our whole team was so happy and proud of ourselves. In conclusion, we lost 4 games but we tried our best and we won the 5th game we played. Overall, we came 5th out of 6 teams by 1.39% and we were definitely cheering the loudest!" - Seren and Eloise, proud members of the girls cricket team!

"We nearly won a game by two runs and we had a lot of fun although it was hot. We sadly did not win any games but we were close. Our first game we lost by 180 runs but in cricket that is super close because the score goes up so quickly. Election BBQ and Cake Stall

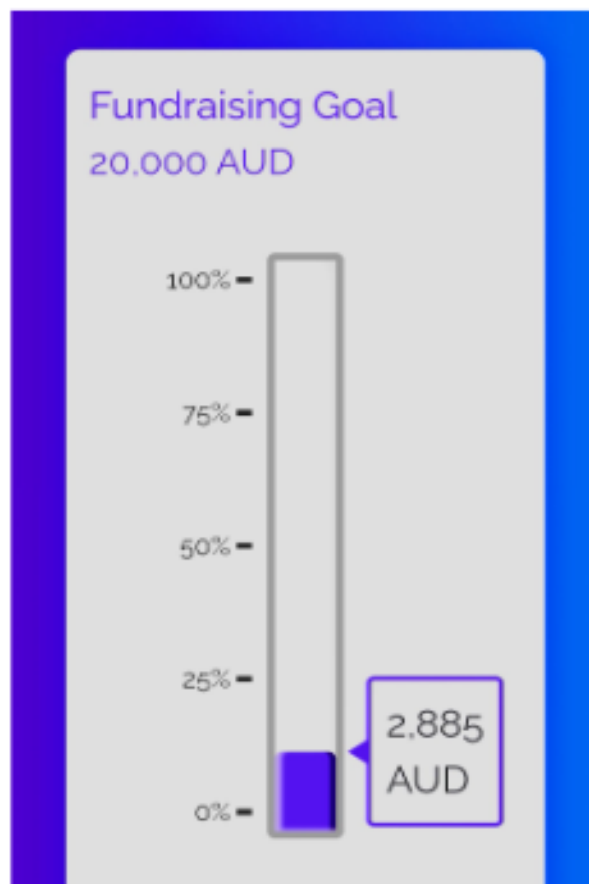
