### NAIDOC Week - Calling for Volunteers

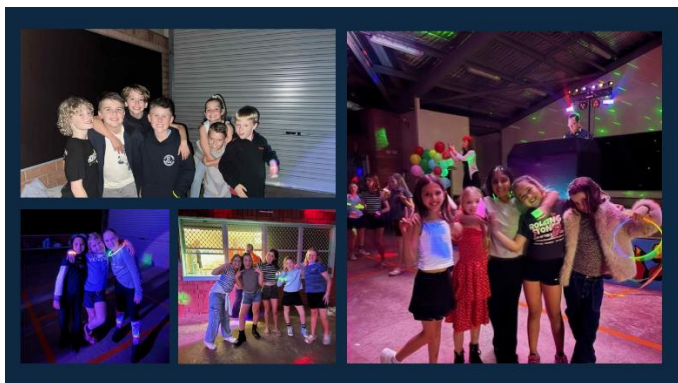

### Kindergarten 2026

We are now accepting applications for enrolment for Kindergarten 2026 for children born between **1 July 2021 and 30 June 2022**. You can obtain a copy by emailing [acir@humanservices.gov.au](mailto:acir@humanservices.gov.au), phoning ACIR on 1800 653 809 or from Medicare. We also require proof of your address in the form of either a lease agreement, utility bill or Council rates. Please go to our website for enrolment forms or you can collect a form from our office. Enrolments are due back **18 July 2025**.

### Fun ways to expose kids to new foods

Every exposure children have to a new food is a step towards a yum!

**Create vegetable art**  
using cut fruit and veg as stamps for painting or pressing. Use hard veg like potatoes and carrots.

**Try sensory bins**  
which contain new foods and help children explore new textures.

**Play a sensory guessing game**  
by preparing veg or fruit in a few different ways. Using a blindfold, feel, smell, and taste (optional) each item and describe the sensation.

**Use our snack mats**  
where children place cut vegetables on the picture to add details and depth.

**Invite kids**  
to help with food preparation and cooking.

**Involve kids**  
in food shopping. Try giving them a vegetable shopping list.

**Read storybooks**  
or watch videos together that feature new foods.

**Make food sculptures**  
using toothpicks and food to create a shape or character (think Mr. Potato Head).

### Understanding Food Sensory Sensitivity

Little people learn about the world through their senses, including when they

hear see touch smell taste

Our senses are involved in eating and can help explain why every child has different likes or dislikes when it comes to food. Some children can be more sensitive to one or more of these senses, which can limit the variety of food they consume.

#### Common causes of sensory sensitivities

A range of factors can influence certain sensory sensitivities to food, such as:

- Issues with chewing or swallowing
- Being a supertaster
- Past negative experiences with the food (choking or being sick after eating)
- Genetics
- Social or cultural influences
- Medical conditions and/or medication
- General dislike of certain textures

#### Staged exposures to help children become comfortable with new foods

Every time your child is exposed to a food, it helps with their learning journey. Some children may benefit from staged exposure to new foods as this may help overcome sensitivities. In the beginning, start slowly and at a stage that is comfortable for them. Take small steps, allowing your child to choose when they are ready to progress to more interaction with a food.

**Make sure you don't force moving through the stages. If your child shows any discomfort, praise their current effort and finish the activity.**

## Ms Cullen's Music Matters



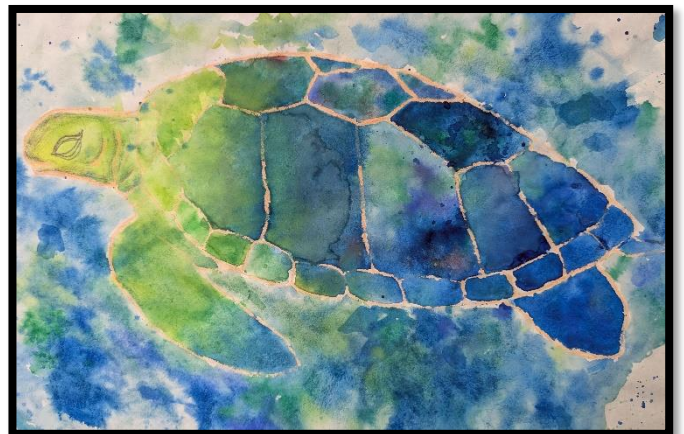

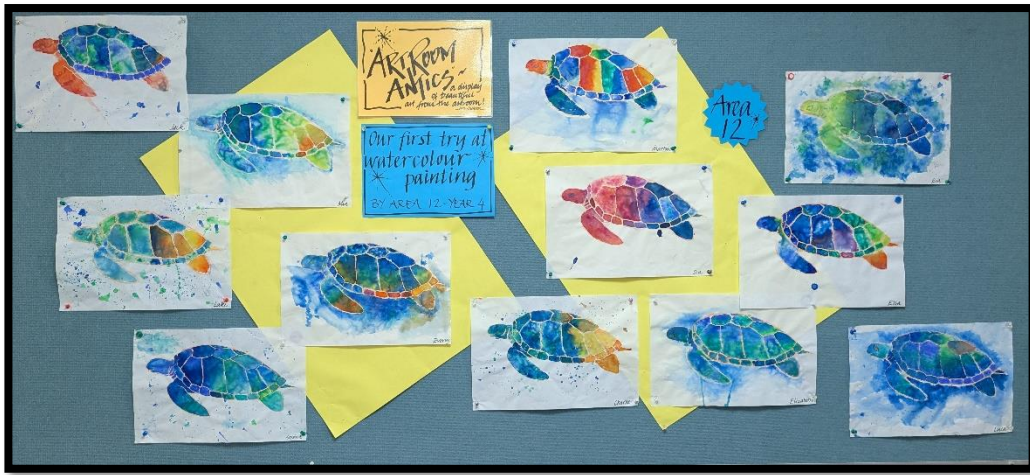




### News from the Art Room

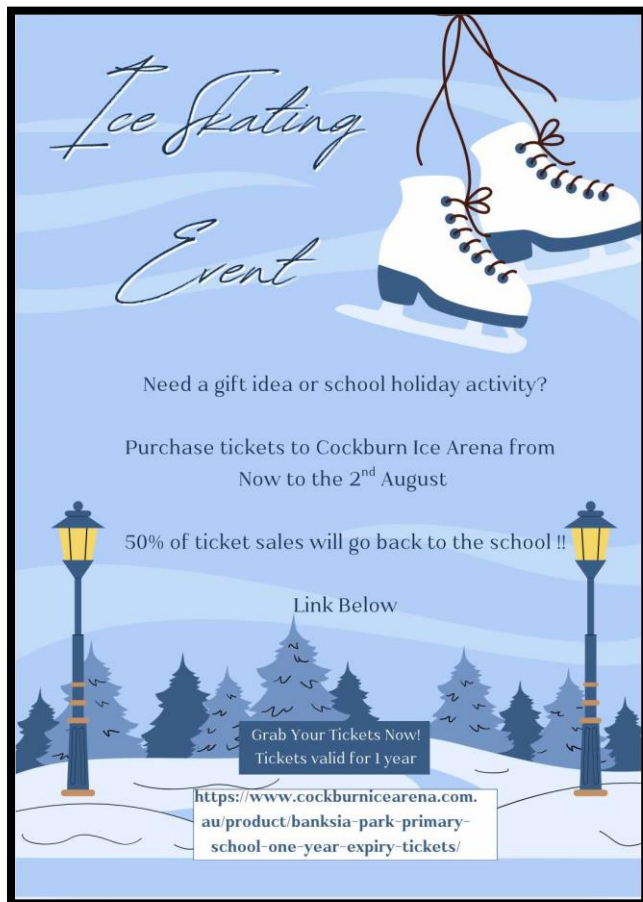

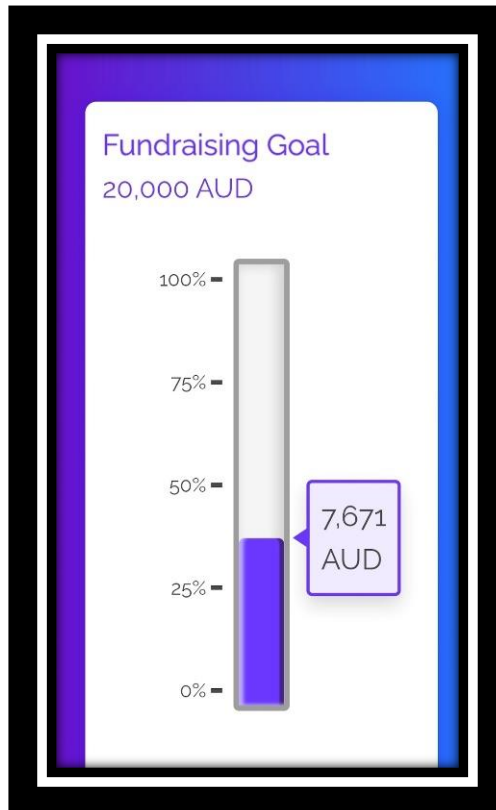
